

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



Note on the Director

Muccino was born in Rome, Italy in 1967. He began his film career as an assistant to Italian directors Pupi Avati ("The Story of Boys and Girls") and Marco Risi ("Steam: The Turkish Bath"). After attending Rome's Centro Sperimentale di Cinematografia, he worked as documentary and short filmmaker for Radio Audizioni Italiane, Italy's public radio and television broadcaster. He soon directed his first feature, "That's It" ("Ecco Fatto" 1998), his next film, "But Forever on My Mind" (1999), His first foray into strictly dramatic territory, "Last Kiss" showed the director's growing maturity through a group of twentysomething male friends grappling with the onset of their own adulthood. Ever since "Last Kiss," Muccino had been trying to get work on American films, but to no avail. Muccino directed "The Pursuit of Happyness* (2006).

Synopsis

The year is 1914, and as World War I continues to rage across the European country-side, four individuals stuck on the front lines find themselves faced with the unthinkable in director Christian Carion's Academy Award-nominated account of the true-life wartime event that would offer hope for peace in mankind's darkest hour. When the war machines began rolling in the summer of 1914, the devastation that it waged upon German, British, and French troops was palpable. As the winter winds began to blow and the soldiers sat huddled in their trenches awaiting the generous Christmas care packages sent by the families, the sounds of warfare took a momentary backseat to the yearning for brotherhood among all of mankind. It is here that the fate of a French lieutenant, a Scottish priest, a German tenor, and a Danish soprano's lives were about to be changed forever. On Christmas Eve of that year, the lonely souls of the front lines abandoned their arms to reach out to their enemies on the battlefield and greet them with not anger or hostility, but with the simple, kindly gesture of a much needed cigarette or a treasured piece of chocolate, and to put their differences aside long enough to wish their brothers a sincere "Merry Christmas!"

Note on the Director

After his graduation of the Center for Study and Research of the Image and Sound, he became assistant director, then director of films for television (FPS, TF1, Antenne 2) from 1977 to 1984. During this period, it also produces short films, including the last, the sea was selected at the Cannes Film Festival in 1983. Synopsis

Mouloud, the father, a simple farmer from Aures is informed, that his son a Policeman has died in an accident. Mouloud drives all night on a deserted road to Batna, a town which is 150 km away from his home to collect his son's body. Mouloud drives home with the coffin on his motorized tricycle's back. Mouloud returns home, which is at the top of mountain where his wife and his three daughters are waiting for him silently. In the shadow of a tree, next to their house, they bury their loved son and brother. Seeing Fatima, his wife is in deep sadness, he remembers a video, in his son's belonging's. He is convinced that his son's images will make his wife recover. But how? The family has no TV, no video recorder, nor electricity. He therefore decides to fight against the administrative complexities to have electricity at home, in order to watch that tape, which represents the last living souvenir of a dead son.

Synopsis

Arif, a young director, has adapted for film one of the popular Mahabharata episode of Eklavya's offering of honorarium to his teacher Dronacharya. Eklavya sacrificed his right thumb to Drona so that Arjuna's supremacy in archery is upheld. While making the film on this mythological incident, Arif comes to know from the Santhals that for archery the arrow needs to be held between the right index and middle fingers - the thumb has no role to play in it. This revelation makes Arif extremely amazed. He was puzzled with the question then why did Eklavya had to sacrifice his right thumb as Gurudakshina if it was not essential for archery? There begins Arif's new analysis, and as a result a novel episode takes shape mingling the realism of the past with the present.



Many things were not consistent with the dream of Arif. He found similarities in the two families with the social reality of three hundred years old Shakespeare's "Romeo and Juliet" and hundred fifty years old Tolstoy's "Little Girls Wiser than Men". This reality frustrated Arif, and he found one of his dreams' sights as well. Both film and reality compiled together in his imagination. He became one of the characters of the film.

Nic Balthazar made his first steps on international podia at a very young age, when the children musicals in which he played even hit Broadway. Even before graduating from university he became a theatreand later a well known film critic. First for newspapers, then for radio. 


Note on the Director

"Alice's House" is Chico Teixeira's first narrative feature film. He has been working as a director in the documentary field since 1989. His first film is "Favelas" (Shanty Towns) (1989), awarded in Brazil and in Portugal, at the Algarye International Festival. Then he directed "Velhice" (Old Age) (1991), a nearly shocking documentary on the daily lives of the elderly in nursing homes, after which he was invited to join many international festivals, such as the National Educational Film Festival and the Video Festival in the US, the 14th Tokyo Video Festival in Japan, and the 34th International Leipzig Festival in Germany. "Criaturas Que Nasciam em Segredo" "Creatures Born in Secret" received 21 national prizes.

DREAMS OF DUST / RÊVES DE POUSSIÈRE

Synopsis

Mocktar, a Nigerien peasant, comes looking for work in Essakane, a dusty gold mine in Northeast Burkina Faso, Africa, where he hopes to forget the past that haunts him. In Essakane, he quickly finds out, the gold rush ended twenty years before, and the inhabitants of this wasteland and strange timelessness manage to exist simply from force of habit. The beautiful Coumba, however, is still courageously struggling to raise her daughter after the death of her family. Mocktar will soon be fighting not only to survive, but also to provide a better future for this mother and her child.

Note on the Director

Laurent Salgues (b. 1967, France) initially studied audiovisual media at the École Supérieure d'Audiovisuel (ESAV) in Toulouse, and then went on to study scriptwriting in Paris, New York and at the UCLA in California. Beaten and raped by her new husband with the help of his parents, she tries desperately to escape but is trapped both by the closed culture and by the very remote location of the village. Unlike other kidnapped brides, she refuses to accept her fate even when she becomes pregnant, but her repeated escape attempts lead only to continuing brutality and betrayal.

Note on the Director

Li Yang Born into a family of actors in Yian, China in 1959.He grew up in the theatre, and was an actor at Beijing Youth Theatre from 1978-85.He studied directing at Beijing Television Institute from 1985-87. subsequently studying German language and literature at the Free University in Berlin from 1989-90 and in Munich from 1990-92. He has also worked as an actor for German television. He studied directing at Cologne Art College for Media from 1992-95.After making three documentaries in Germany, MANG JING marks his feature film debut. He lives in Beijing. In China, however, the film's critical eye toward the notoriously dangerous mining industry proved controversial and Blind Shaft was banned by the Beijing Film Bureau. Despite his worries, the ban was eventually lifted.

Synopsis

Beautiful and self-confident Tuya refuses to leave her pastureland. She'd rather stay here with her disabled husband, two children and one hundred sheep, and continue to pursue a life of privation in the endless expanse of the steppe. But all the hard work begins to take its toll on Tuya. Her husband Bater tries to convince her to divorce him, but Tuya refuses to comply even with his wishes. One day, she falls ill and for the first time begins to consider a divorce, because this would enable her to find someone to help her to look after Bater, the two children and their one hundred sheep. However, none of her suitors are prepared to take on Bater - until Tuya's old classmate Baolier arrives on the scene. Having found a very nice nursing home for Bater, he persuades Tuya and the children to move to town. But, far away from the steppe and separated from his family, Bater finds it impossible to get used to life at the home. In desperation he slashes his wrists. When the news reaches Tuya, she realises that the time has come for her to act ...

Synopsis

Structured in five days, with the dynamics of numerous characters and seemingly connected events, the film pictures a love triangle. Such apparent order of life ill inevitably break into pieces in the collision with the real life which is - unpredictable... Problems which have been brewing for years for successful 35-year-old architect Nikola Jeren come to a head in the space of five days. A life of lies and emotional turmoil has taken its toll on the man, he has no self-respect and doesn't know what he really wants. His long-term mistress Ana, a work colleague, is weary from all the years they've had to conceal their relationship, she wants him to get a divorce. His wife Maja, the mother of Nikola's 8-year-old daughter, is also pressing him to finally come to a decision. Nikola is imprisoned in a situation which cannot be resolved, whatever he does, he'll only hurt everyone he ever loved even more. Can something decide for us, something we're no longer used to expecting in life a tragic coincidence?



A film recounting the history of a landscape, that of East Prussia, and of its inhabitants. An area rich in history, it was once home to co-existing communities of Germans, Poles, Lithuanians and Jews. After World War II and Stalin's deportation of the Germans, the Prussian province became a Russian exclave of strategic rather than economic significance, an absurd residue of political power games. The fourth film by Volker Koepp about the area known as the Kaliningrad Oblast deals with the generation born in the 1990s, youngsters to whom the Soviet Union and East Prussia are names in school textbooks. They live in a different teality, with parents and grandparents who were forcibly resettled in the area and never put down roots. They have meanwhile resigned themselves to being unemployed, and take solace in alcohol. Left to themselves, the older children take care of the younger ones, play with whatever they find lying about. Liuda, for instance, can't wait to come of age, because then her brother will arrive to take her out of the children's home.

Note on the Director

Volker Koepp is one of the most renowned East German documentary filmmakers working today in Germany. His career has spanned over 35 years and 40 films, many of them winning international awards. Over the years, the Goethe-Institut has presented several of his film, including Cold Homeland and Wittstock, Wittstock. Note on the Director

Bahman Ghobadi was born in 1969 in Baneh, a city near the Iran-Iraq border in the province of Iranian Kurdistan. When he was twelve, civil disputes forced his entire family to immigrate to the provincial capital of Sanandaj. Ghobadi studied industrial photography and film directing at the Iranian Broadcasting College, but he honed his filmmaking skills shooting short documentaries on 8mm film as he traveled and collected stories among the Kurdish people. By the mid-1990s, Ghobadi's short films had begun to receive recognition in Iran and abroad. His short film Life in Fogthe true story of a fourteen-year-old boy who provides for his siblings after the death of their parents on the Iran/ Iraq border-was a landmark in Iranian documentary cinema and formed the basis for his full-length narrative feature A Time for Drunken Horses (1999). The first Kurdish feature film in the history of Iranian cinema.




Note on the Director

For that, however, he must cut down old trees growing on the land. He seeks the horticulture department's advice and negotiates with a sawmill willing to fell the trees. But when the mill workers come Banavva, the former landowner's widow, refuses to let them cut the trees, saying she has sold the land but not the trees! This upsets Amaresh who has borrowed from the bank to develop the land. To make her see reason Amaresh requests a meeting of the village elders. They instruct Banavva to return the money and retain her land. The poor widow fails to do so. To retain the trees she attempts suicide: first she threatens to jump off a high wall, next she jumps into a well. Both times she survives and becomes the laughing stock of the village.

Amaresh is under pressure from the bank as well as the sawmill owner. His rivals in the village have complained to local authorities of encroachment, and he is falling in the eyes of his mother-in-law. So he procures the forest department's permission to cut the trees.

Banavva now tries to hang herself in public. A stunned Amaresh rescues her but finds that Banavva has lost her voice, and rushes her to the city hospital. During this human interaction he learns about her background and is transformed.

But the sawmill owner needs the trees, so he arrives with police protection to fell them. The village community draws together and succeeds in protecting the trees. The womenfolk celebrate this in Banawa's field. While people sing and play, Banawa dies a silent death. Her body is put to rest under a tree planted by her, and Amaresh plants another on her grave.



Note on the Director

Vittorio De Seta (born October 15, 1923) is an Italian cinema director. He was born in Palermo, Sicily, to a wealthy family, and studied architecture in Rome, before deciding to become a director. He made ten short documentaries between 1954 and 1959, before directing his first feature length film, Banditi a Orgosolo (Bandits of Orgosolo). His early documentaries focus on the everyday life of many of Sicily's poorest workers, and are notable for their lack of voiceover narration, quiet mood, and striking color. In 1966, De Seta co-wrote and directed "Un Uomo a Meta'/Almost a Man" which depicted the mental collapse of a struggling writer. De Seta's third film was "L'Invitee/The Invited" (1969), a well-made character study of marital difficulties.

Musician Mario Tronco and filmmaker Agostino Ferrente are two friends who both live in Rome's Piazza Vittorio neighborhood, a multi-ethnic community which is largely populated by immigrants from all corners of the world. Piazza Vittorio is also home to a beautiful vintage theater, the Apollo, which was had been used for years as a concert hall. In 2001, due to waning attendance, the owners were considering selling the venue to entrepreneurs who wanted to turn it into a bingo parlor. Determined to prevent this from happening, Tronco and Ferrente started a community organization with an eye towards turning the Apollo into a multi-media performance space, and with this in mind they began assembling a musical ensemble, using talent from the neighborhood. The group eventually grew to thirty musicians, featuring musicians who embraced a variety of musical styles, ethnic instruments and approaches towards their instruments.







Six months later, Erik and his friends come to visit Phillip at a psychiatric hospital to bring him home after long-term treatment. Writing is the last thing on Phillip's mind, but Erik is continuing his literary attempts and tries to convince his friend to go back to writing. This film could be seen as a subtle reflection on youth as a time of promise, plans and hopes which gradually dissolve under the impact of life experiences. If the style of the narration is reminiscent of the poetic works of the French New Wave, it's no coincidence: the director admits to the influence of François Truffaut, in particular, the latter's Jules and Jim, in which fundamental themes are treated with an enchantingly light touch.

Erik (38) consdiers leaving his wife and children for his somewhat younger lover Kaja. Sverre (46) reluctantly has to participate in swinging in an attempt to boost a relationship that has gone dull. Their father visits his beloved - but senile - wife every week, and has started wondering if there wasn't anything more to life.

The father and his two sons meet every Sunday, but all they talk about is soccer - and the fear that their favourite team Skeid would have to move down one division.

This tragicomic story shows us it is not all that easy to be an ordinary man. But even if you move down one division, all is not lost.





Note on the Director

Dariusz Gajewski, Born in 1964 in Czestochowa. He studied law at the Jagiellonian University. He graduated from the Faculty Directing the Lodz film school. After studies began cooperation with TVP, which has carried out in several documentary films. In 1999, in Warsaw Dramatic Theater directed LEATHER MASK Helmut Kraussera. Art is then used for canvas movie script ALARM (2002), which was established as an independent production. Gajewski cinema debut IS in Warsaw. At the last PFFF Gdynia won most of the major prizes. This verdict aroused controversy and divided the critics.





Alain Resnais

One of France's most distinctive and highly regarded directors, Alain Resnais was born in Vannes, France, in 1922. He studied at L'Institut hautes études cinématographiques before starting a career as a film-maker in the mid-1940s, making short films. Of these, the most celebrated is Nuit et brouillard (1955), an eye-opening and devastatingly poignant documentary about deportations and Nazi concentration camps during the Second World War.

Resnais' first full-length film was Hiroshima mon amour (1959), an unusual romantic drama which was developed from an idea for a short documentary. The film was critically acclaimed in France and abroad and won Resnais instant fame, establishing him as a major director of the French New Wave. His following film, L'année dernière à Marienbad (1961), was no less successful, a remarkable interplay of time and memory with some unforgettable visual imagery.

The cinema of Alain Resnais has always been challenging the boundaries and our assumptions of what cinema should be about, perhaps more successfully than any other director. Although some of his films are highly artistic, abstract and inaccessible, others have won notable mainstream success. Few directors have achieved this degree of diversity whilst pursuing an extraordinarily artistic vision of cinema. Alain Resnais' work is challenging, mysterious and often entertaining, but it is also remarkably coherent, showing a keen appreciation of human issues whilst exposing a creative force of great talent and daring. Resnais has regularly worked with such distinguished French literary figures as Marguerite Duras and Alain Robbe-Grillet, encouraging them to write the script as a piece of literature rather than as a screenplay. He then transposes their vision into cinematic terms, in a style richly impregnated with his own sensibility. Notable among his later works are Stavisky (1974), Providence (1977), and Mon oncle d'Amérique (1980), winner of a special jury prize at the Cannes (Fr.) film festival. A resident of Paris, Resnais numbered among his close friends many lesser known actors and technicians he worked with. His films epitomized the unusual blend of circumspection and commitment in his own personality. Although he dealt regularly with problems of personal and political action, his radical commitment has often been underestimated by critics mesmerized by his immaculate style. His short films had several brushes with government censorship. Les Statues meurent aussi (1953; "Statues Also Die"), his study of African art, was banned for 12 years for references to colonialism that he refused to alter. Some critics condemned Hiroshima mon amour for its sympathetic treatment of the heroine, once a wartime collaborationist and later an interracial adulteress who advocated internationalism and the "New Morality." Even when Resnais deals explicitly with political figures, however, as in La Guerre est finie (1966; "The War Is Over"), his scrupulosity and tragic humanism are so much in evidence that his work transcends partisan feelings

HIROSHIMA, MY LOVE / HIROSHIMA MON AMOUR

A young French actress is making an anti-war film in the rebuilt Japanese city of Hiroshima, which was devastated in a nuclear bomb blast at the end of the Second World War. The actress admits that she will soon have to fly back home to Paris, but she spends one last night with her lover. At a café, she recounts the story of her first tragic love with a German soldier during the war... Hiroshima mon amour started out as a documentary about the reconstruction of Hiroshima, and the first fifteen minutes of the film uses documentary footage to great effect to set the scene.

GUERNICA

Synopsis

In the midst of a grueling and increasingly brutal Spanish Civil War, the ancient Basque town of Guernica was subjected to an extended duration bombardment campaign by German forces in an unrelenting aerial campaign designed to demoralize the collective psyche of the Basque nation and to also show camaraderie (and military alliance) with the nationalists under Generalissimo Francisco Franco. Composed of a series of fractured, compartmentalized images that traces the evolution of the paintings and sculptures of cubist artist Pablo Picasso from 1906 to 1937 (leading to his masterwork Guernica) set against an evocative narrative ode written by French lyrical poet Paul Éluard and recited in an off-screen performance reading by Jacques Pruvost and María Casarès, Guernica is a thoughtful and passionate meditation on barbarism, warfare, and human resilience. Alain Resnais incorporates ingenious, rapid cut editing strategies and fragmented, subset images that not only visually integrate the principles of cubism in cinematic form, but moreover, reinforce the film's overarching, thematic structure of multifacetedness that subtly - but inescapably - reflect on Spain's (then) continued struggle under fascism at the end of World War II.





Aki Kaurismäki

Aki Kaurismäki (born April 4, 1957, in Orimattila) is a Finnish film director, screenwriter, and producer. He started his career as a co-director in the films of his elder brother Mika Kaurismäki. His first film was Crime and Punishment made in 1983, based on Dostoevsky's famous crime story set in modern-day Helsinki. His first International recognition came with film Leningrad Cowboys Go America made in 1989. His style has been influenced a lot by directors such as Jean-Pierre Melville and Robert Bresson, as he relies on low-key acting and simple cinematic storytelling to get himself across. His movies have a unique downplayed humorous side. His signature elements include deadpan humor, vivid color palette, kitschy mise-en-scene and irony of situation. He uses these elements to reflect the disillusionment, crisis of identity, and existential angst.

Kaurismäki in his films has often incorporated traditional stylistic devices of overarching music, directed stage lighting, expressionistic gestures, skewed camera angles, and meticulously composed slow motion shots. He also has portrayed anti-heroes in few of his films which have become archetypal Kaurismäki anti-heroes.

Much of his work is centered on his native city of Helsinki, particularly Calamari Union which is largely set in the working class neighbourhood. His famous trilogy that comprises Shadows in Paradise, Ariel, and The Match Factory Girl - all three films are set in these surroundings. In his one of the most acclaimed films The Match Factory Girl, Kaurismäki creates a wickedly incisive and fascinating dark comedy. He reflects the sustained, dispassionate cynicism and alienation of the contemporary society through his protagonist. Furthermore, the pervasive silence, emotional callousness, and physical isolation of the protagonist reflect the innate loneliness and dehumanization of the soul.

His films are linked in that they are straightforward, seriocomic studies infused with a unique sense of the ridiculous. His characters are far removed from the mainstream, in some cases to the point of being isolated and completely alone; occasionally, they are on the road, roaming across land-scapes in which they will be eternal outsiders. But their feelings of alienation or despondency rarely become the principal force at work on screen. Rather, Kaurismaki elicits poignancy as he charts his characters' lives, with a special emphasis on the humor that symbolizes the utter absurdity of their situations.





Dan Wolman

Born in Jerusalem on 28 Oct.1941. Spent the first years of his life in Ethiopia. After finishing high school in Jerusalem Dan studied film in the U.S. From 1962 to 1965 at The Film Institute of City College New York. From 1965 to 1968 he completed his studies at New York University. In 1968 Dan returned to Israel and shot his first feature -

1970 "The Dreamer" an official entry at Cannes Film Festival. "Empathy for the plight of Israel's Ethiopian immigrants animates a film that won first prize at the Jerusalem International Film Festival in 2000 Dan Wolman, an Israeli film director with childhood roots in Ethiopia and years of TV work there, explores their problems in "Foreign Sister," a dramatic story about a Jewish housewife and her maid, linked by loss and laughter. Wolman's empathy can be traced to his father's background and an almost forgotten page of World War II history. After receiving his medical education in Mussolini's Italy, Wolman's father immigrated to Palestine and joined the British army. He served under the daring leadership of Major General Orde Charles Wingate, who led a guerrilla force into Italian-occupied Ethiopia to help restore Haile Selassie to the throne in 1941. Dr. Wolman became the emperor's personal physician, eventually bringing his wife and his son Dan to join him, before returning to Palestine in 1946.



Kim Ki-duk

Kim Ki-duk (born December 20, 1960 in South Korea) is a Korean filmmaker noted for his idiosyncratic "art-house" cinematic works. He studied fine arts in Paris from 1990 to 1993. He began his career as a screenwriter and won the first prize in a scenario contest held by Korean Film Council in 1995. In 1996 he made his debut as a director with the film Crocodile, which received sensational reviews from critics in South Korea. In 2004, he received Best Director awards at two different film festivals, for two different films. At the Berlin International Film Festival, he was awarded for Samaritan Girl (2004), and at the Venice Film Festival he won for 3-Iron (2004).

Free of any institutional education in film, he never served as assistant director or developed film mania. This is the reason for the freedom he was able to embrace as a filmmaker. His films can be considered as autobiographical writing with a film camera. This is why Kim describes each and every one of his films as a 'sequence' within his entire body of work. The focus on marginal people and spaces and a decidedly anti-mainstream aesthetic marks his films. The films of Kim Ki-Duk tend to make one uncomfortable & they are often defined as 'grotesque'. To Kim, his life, his films and cruelty are intertwined with each other. The cruel reality he expresses may be feared by the audience and abhorred by the critics, yet if the energy that inundates his films should be acknowledged as dark and wrongful, it cannot just be a matter of his films. Rather it must be seen as his attempt to address the cruelty of our lives and of the world we live in. He takes us to that reality, into the direction of self-reform. Such modest effort for Kim is a starting point, foreseeing the revolution of the world.



YOUSSEF CHAHINE

(January 25, 1926 - July 27, 2008)

Born in Alexandria, Egypt, Youssef Chahine studied acting at the Pasadena Playhouse in California. He directed his first film, Baba Amine, in 1953, at the age of twenty-four. Considered to be one of the most important international film directors, Chahine is also one of the most eclectic, having directed everything from musicals to melodramas, autobiography to comedy, and neo-realist to political films. His movies pushed the traditional boundaries of Arab cinema.

Alexandria Why?, his most autobiographical film, innovated the use of first-person narrative, while other films, such as Cairo Station, explored issues of sexuality and madness for the first time. His more political films, such as The Return of the Prodigal Son (an adaptation of André Gide's novel), explored the social politics of the Arab-Israel War, while films such as Once upon a Time on the Nile concentrated a strong critical eye on the construction of the Aswan High Dam. Chahine also acted in a few of his films.

Youssef Chahine is one of the most forceful and complex of Egyptian filmmakers whose progress over the years offers remarkable insight into the evolution of Egyptian society. Chahine is a key figure in Third World cinema. Unlike some of the other major filmmakers who also emerged in the 1950s-such as Satyajit Ray or Lester James Peries-he has not turned his back on commercial cinema. Chahine's strength as a filmmaker lies indeed in his ability to combine mainstream production techniques with a very individual style and approach. Chahine's inventiveness in forms and consistency in content makes him an important filmmaker in Egypt in particular and in the non-Western filmmaking world in general.



Kon Ichikawa

(November 20, 1915 - February 13, 2008)

In 1933, Ichikawa started his career in the in the animation department of J.O. Studio θ eventually moved to the feature film department as an assistant director when the company became a complete production company, working under such luminaries as Yutake Abe and Nobuo Aoyagi. Ichikawa started as a cartoonist θ and the greatest influence on his films are Chaplin (particularly The Gold Rush) as well as Disney.

Ichikawa's films are marked with certain darkness and bleakness, punctuated with sparks of humanity. His main trait is technical expertise, irony, detachment and a drive for realism married with a complete spectrum of genres. Thematically, too, Ichikawa's work displays a remarkable consistency. Skeptical attitude to his country's traditions and institutions recurs as a theme in his works. The death of parents is another recurrent motif in Ichikawa's work. Some critics class him with Akira Kurosawa, Kenji Mizoguchi and Yasujiro Ozu as one of the masters of Japanese cinema.

He gained western recognition during the 1950s and 1960s with a number of bleak films-two antiwar films with The Burmese Harp and Fires on the Plain, Alone on the Pacific (Taiheiyo hitoribotchi) and the technically formidable period-piece An Actor's Revenge (Yukinojo henge) about a kabuki actor. His best films, despite the tighter restrictions on filmmakers at the period of their production, were willing to deal with most aspects of life. The precision of observation is their great virtue.

His acerbic account of tradition, modernisation and alienation in twentieth century Japan will remain one of the more eloquent examinations of how his country came to be as it now is.

The battalion's harp player, Mizushima, is sent on a liaison mission to persuade another troop into surrender from a mountain in Burma. But Mizushima fails and after encountering the full carnage of war, bodies of his fellow countrymen piled high and left to rot, he refuses to return to his troop. Appropriating the Buddhist ethos, Mizushima devotes himself to burying each of his comrades, sparing them the ignominy suffered in wartime with the dignity of a humane burial.

Dramatic overhead shots of a solitary figure, the quest of one man's journey to find an inner sanctum, lilting melodies extending emotion where words seem futile, this is truly a magnificent epic on every level.





Vijay Tendulkar

(January 6, 1928 - May 19, 2008)

Vijay Tendulkar was a leading Indian playwright, movie and television writer, literary essayist, political journalist, and social commentator primarily in Marathi. He is best known for his plays, Shantatal Court Chalu Aahe (1967), Ghashiram Kotwal (1972), and Sakharam Binder (1972). Many of Tendulkar's plays derived inspiration from real-life incidents or social upheavals, which provides clear light on harsh realities.

Based on a 1956 short story, "Die Panne" ("Traps") by Friedrich Dürrenmatt, Tendulkar wrote the play, "Shantata! Court Chalu Aahe" ("Silence! The Court Is In Session"). It was presented on the stage for the first time in 1967, and proved as one of his finest works. Satyadev Dubey presented it in movie form in 1971 with Tendulkar's collaboration as the screenplay writer.

In his 1972 play, Sakharam Binder (Sakharam, the Binder), Tendulkar dealt with the topic of domination of the male gender over the female gender. Same year, he wrote another, even much more acclaimed play, Ghashiram Kotwal ("Ghashiram, the Constable"), which dealt with political violence. The play is a political satire created as a musical drama set in 18th century Pune. It combined traditional Marathi folk music and drama with contemporary theater techniques, creating a new paradigm for Marathi theater. The play demonstrates Tendulkar's deep study of group psychology [9], and it brought him a "Jawaharlal Nehru Fellowship" (1974-75) for a project titled, "An Enquiry Into the Pattern of Growing Violence in Society and Its Relevance to Contemporary Theatre". With over six thousand performances thus far in its original and translated versions, "Ghashiram Kotwal" remains one of the longest-running plays in the history of Indian

Tendulkar wrote screenplays for the movies Nishant (1974), akrosh (The Cry) (1980), and Ardh Satya (The Half-Truth) (1984). He has written eleven movies in Hindi and eight movies in Marathi. The latter include Samana ("Confrontation") (1975), Simhaasan ("Throne") (1979), and Umbartha ("The Threshold") (1981).

By providing insight into major social events and political upheavals during his adult life, Tendulkar became one of the strongest radical political voices in Maharashtra in recent times. He has translated nine novels, two biographies, and five plays by other authors into Marathi.



A burly man with a heart of gold, M.P.Shankar was one of the most unique personalities to stride the Kannada screen by virtue of his versatility and total dedication to the film medium. A wrestler in the prime of his youth, he initially made his mark on the Kannada screen, which he entered through professional theatre, as a villain, but switched over to a wide range of roles, establishing himself firmly as a highly versatile character actor. But it was through his series of films based on wildlife and environment, some of which turned out to be classics, like 'Gandhada gudi', that he made an abiding impression on the Kannada film lovers. Shankar had to expose himself to a lot of financial risks for trying to specialize in this genre of film making, but he carried on, regardless. His environmental activism, alas, has had hardly any emulators.

As a person also, Shankar was a class apart. He was virtually a loner, but was readily available for all professional and social causes. He was never in the gossip circuit and remained quite aloof, sharing the joy of his achievements, with others but nursing the pain of his own failures all by himself. His long association with the film industry brought in a heap of laurels but no financial stability. He died of cancer, a rather unhappy man, but Kannada cinema remains ever grateful to him.



A quiet man who virtually kept his counsel to himself and went about his task without any ostentation was K.V.Jayaram, a director who distinguished himself as one who brought several popular Kannada novels to the screen. Like the illustrious Puttanna Kanagal, he had a penchant for adapting literary works to his films and left behind him a distinguished repertoire of movies like 'Hosa Neeru', 'Badada Hoovu', 'Bettale Seve', "Ibbani Karagitu', "Mududida Taavare Aralitu', 'Aruna Raga' and so on. He belonged to the school of the late M.R. Vittal, another venerated name in Kannada cinema, with whom he was associated in many of his landmark films, but later branched out on his own. Jayaram also trained himself as a film editor and made his debut as a director in 'Maralu Sarapani', a suspense thriller. Popular as this maiden film was, Jayaram later specialized in sensitive and moving family dramas based on human relationships.

Jayaram's forte was simple and heartwarming low budget films shorn of frills and ostentation. The only wide canvassed film he attempted was 'Sharavegada Saradara', but soon went back to his métier. A prolonged illness, which finally took his toll in 2008, kept him away from film making for a few years, but he will be remembered long through his films which glorify, in a manner of speaking human life. He won the coveted Putanna Kanagal award from the Government of Karnataka in 1999-2000.



If the seventies and eighties are regarded as the golden age of Kannada cinema, it was also because of the literary flourish imparted to it by the scripters, dialogue writers and lyricists who elevated film writing often to the level of pure literature. The trio of R.N.Jayagopal, Chi.Udayshankar and Vijayanarasimha and others of their ilk had taken off from where their illustrious predecessors like Hunsur Krishnamurthy, G.V.Iyer, Kurasi, HLN Simha and others had rested to embellish several kannada films with a rich poetic flavor. But Jayagopal was easily the first among these equals by virtue of the fact that he was not only a scripter and lyricist but also a director and technician in his own right and indulged in the television medium as well. Training himself formally in sound engineering, Jayagopal followed the footsteps of his renowned father R.Nagendra Rao, who was a giant on both screen and stage. His brothers, R.N.Krishna Prasad and R.N.Sudarshan, took to cinematography and acting, respectively and carved a niche for themselves in their respective fields. The entire RNR family was involved in the making of some outstanding films of that era.

Jayagopal was a man of many parts. He was active in social circles as a lion and held high positions in that fraternity. His output a lyricist (more than 1200 lyrics for over 300 Kannada films), screenplay and dialogue writer (nearly 200 films) and a director (9films) was prodigious. He is also remembered for his relentless struggle to protect the intellectual property rights of film lyricists as an activist of the Indian Performing Rights Society. He was himself an accomplished violinist and had a keen ear for classical music. He won several awards from the central and state governments for his achievements in cinema, including the coveted 'Kalai Mamani' from the Government of Tamil Nadu.

Jayagopal passed away in the late 2008 in the thick of his ambitious television serial 'Ramayana' on which he had staked all his resources and reputation. The half finished serial was his life's ambition.



Note on the Director

Tage Danielsson (1928-1985), bom in Linköping, early began writing and performing in student comedies while studying at the University of Uppsala He was very successful, and worked main for the Swedish Radio during the 1950s creating a number of very popular come series. By 1956, Danielsson was firmly established as an actor, author and director for both radio and theatre. He teamed up with his fellow comedian Hans Alfredson to form a joint production company Svenska Ord, in the early 1968 They soon formed their own company-SVENSKA ORD (Swedish Words). In the early years of their collaboration they frequently co-wrote shows for radio and television before turning to feature films with much success.

Tage Danielsson was also a well-known and admired author who has written a number of books. He was an active participant in the ecology debate, Amnesty International and the Peace

Movement.





Note on the Director

Lina Wertmüller born on 14 August 1928 is an Italian film director of aristocratic Swiss descent. In 1976, she became the first woman ever to be nominated for an Academy Award for Directing with Seven Beauties. She was known for her whimsically prolix movie titles (which may be due to her long full name), for instance, the literal translation of the Italian title of Swept Away is "Swept away by an unusual destiny in the blue sea of August". These titles were invariably shortened for international release. She has an entry in the Guinness Book of Records for the longest filmtitle:" Un fatto di sangue nel comune di Siculiana fra due uomini per causa di una vedova. Si sospettano moventi politici. Amore-Morte-Shimmy. Lugano belle. Tarantelle. Tarallucci e vino" (a movie from 1979 with 179 characters better known under the international titles Blood Feud or Revenge)









Manoel de Oliveria

Manoel de Oliveira was born in Porto, Portugal on December 11, 1908, to Francisco José de Oliveira and Cândida Ferreira Pinto. His family were wealthy industrialists. Now in his 100 th year, he is often quoted as the oldest active filmmaker in the world.

His first feature film came much later, in 1942. Aniki-Bóbó, a portrait of Oporto's street children, was a commercial failure when it opened, and its merit only came to be recognized over time. This drawback forced Oliveira to abandon other film projects he was involved in, and to dedicate himself to running his family vineyard. He re-emerged onto the film scene in 1956 with The Artist and the City.

In 1963, O Acto de Primavera (The Rite of Spring), a documentary depicting an annual passion play, marked a turning point for his career. This was shortly followed by A caça (The Hunt), a grim feature film that contrasted with the happy tones of his previous documentary.

Oliveira claims to direct movies for the sheer pleasure of doing it, regardless of critical reaction. He maintains a quiet life away from the spotlights, despite multiple honours such as those of the Cannes, Venice and Montréal film festivals. He has been awarded two Career Golden Lions in 1985 and 2004 and a golden palm for his lifetime achievements in 2008



Note on the Director

Fassbinder was born into a bourgeois Bavarian family in 1946. His father was a doctor and his mother a translator. In order to have time for her work, his mother frequently sent him the movies, a practice that gave birth to his obsession with the medium. Later in life, he would claim that he saw a film nearly every day and sometimes as many as three or four. He studied theater in the midsixties at the Fridl-Leonhard Studio in Munich and joined the Action Theater (aka, Anti-Theater) in 1967. His versatility later surfaced in his films where, in addition to some of the aforementioned responsibilities, Fassbinder served as compo ser, production designer, cinematographer, producer and editor. Coupled with his ability to serve in nearly any crew capacity, this gave him the ability to produce his films quickly and on extremely low budgets.



In the back drop of the Dravidian and Dalit movements in Tamil Nadu, SuRa struggled to evolve a modern Tamil literature, independent of its ancient tradition and its associated politics. This often found his writings pitted against his Brahmin background and upbringing. It was a battle all the way for him to revolutionize modern literature in Tamil society, which is stuck with caste identities, traditional hypocrisy, politics, inferiority complexes and language chauvinism. Sundara Ramaswamy, died at the age of 75, on October 15th 2005. As per his last wishes; his cremation was carried out without any rituals.




